HOW DOES NICOTINE ADDICTION IMPACT THE LGBTQ+ COMMUNITY?

Tobacco use remains the country's number one preventable cause of death and disease, resulting in more than 480,000 deaths each year. But it is not an equal opportunity killer.

- » Lesbian, gay, and bisexual youth and adults report higher prevalence of tobacco product use than their heterosexual peers.
- y 43% of transgender and gender nonconforming adults smoke, compared to 19.2% of cisgender adults.

This disproportionate burden is due to a combination of factors, including a history of targeted marketing from the tobacco industry, stigma, social disenfranchisement, and discrimination.

DISCUSSION TIPS

Recommendations from The Trevor Project's "Black and LGBTQ+: Approaching Intersectional Conversations" guide:

Set ground rules:

"One person speaks at a time, using 'I' statements to communicate from your own experiences, and not making assumptions about others' experiences."

Remember your goals:

"If the discussion veers off course...remember your goals and try to turn their attention back to the original topic."

Everyone is the expert about their experience:

"Two differing experiences can both be true and valid at the same time, even among people who share similar identities."

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS AND FACTS FOR THE GROUP TO CONSIDER

A QUESTION ABOUT PRIDE

- The tobacco industry has spent decades capitalizing on LGBT* individuals.
- In 1995, the tobacco company R.J. Reynolds created "Project SCUM" (Sub-Culture Urban Marketing) to boost cigarette sales by targeting gay men and homeless individuals with advertisements and displays placed in communities and stores.
- More recently, tobacco companies have been leveraging social media to advertise e-cigarette products, and LGBT individuals are reporting significantly higher exposure to tobacco-related content on social media than their non-LGBT counterparts.

What do you think about the tobacco industry's targeting of the LGBTQ+ community? Is your vision of yourself and your peers what you think the tobacco industry sees?

A QUESTION ABOUT PROGRESS

- Research has shown that harassment and discrimination of LGBT individuals increases stress and leads to higher tobacco use.
- Research also shows several connections between nicotine addiction and increased symptoms of anxiety and depression, and while many people misinterpret nicotine as a stress reliever, it may be making their symptoms worse.

What are some healthy ways to cope with the stress of anti-LGBTQ+ policies? How can we help members of our community who use nicotine adopt a healthier path?
